

« Otay Tarweed (Hemizonia fasciculata)

Annual Herb - Each flower has a center of six yellowish disc florets with black stamens, surrounded by five yellow ray florets.

« Coast Prickly Pear

in clusters of yellowish spines.

Flowers are yellow or red, fruit is

Succulent - This cactus is covered



« Sugarbush (Rhus ovata)

Evergreen Shrub - Small flowers are white to rose-pink with dark reddish bracts; they bloom at the tips of branches from March to May.



« Shooting Star (Dodecatheon clevelandii)

Perennial Herb - Spikes to 1 foot high; cluster of flowers resemble shooting stars and can be magenta to deep lavender to white.



### « San Diego Sunflower

(Viquiera laciniata)

(Opuntia littoralis)

purplish-red.

Perennial Herb - Multi-branched shrub with light green leaves: resinous. Produces large quantities of bright yellow flowers.

« Spanish Dagger

Evergreen Tree/Shrub -

Short-stemmed spiny plant

that grows to 3-12 feet tall.

« Star Lily (also called Fremont Camas) (Zigadenus fremontii)

Perennial Herb - Flower spike has showy star-shaped flowers; its spikes are white with green centers.



### « Toyon

(Heteromeles arbutifolia)

Evergreen Shrub - Dark green leaves; small white flowers in the summer, red berries in the winter.



### « California Sycamore

(Platanus racemosa)

« Snake Cholla

(Cylindropuntia californica)

Deciduous Tree - Large maple like leaves; round, spiked seed pods.

# « Arroyo Willow

(Salix lasiolepis)

Deciduous Tree/Shrub -Narrow leaves, flowers early spring; produces white fuzzy seeds called catkins.




# « White Sage



« Bladderpod

(Isomeris arborea) Perennial Shrub - Yellow flowers: dried fruit resembles a paper lantern that rattles.



« Bush Monkeyflower

(Mimulus aurantiacus)

Perennial Shrub - Sticky leaves with a 1-inch flower: it is semi-dormant in the summer.



« Blue-Eyed Grass

(Sisyrinchium bellum)

Perennial Herb - Six-tepaled blue-violet flowers with a vellow center.



« Bush Mallow

(Malacothamnus fasciculatus)

Evergreen Shrub - Thin slender branches produce an abundance of pink flowers; blooms most of the summer.



« California Buckwheat

(Eriogonum fasciculatum)

Evergreen Shrub - Dense clusters of pinkish white fuzzy flowers; long bloom period from March through November.



« Black Sage

(Salvia mellifera)

Evergreen Shrub - A flat fragrant shrub with darker green textured foliage; light blue flowers.



« Southern Cattail

(Typha domingensis)

Perennial Herb - Grows in boggy pond margins or shallow water.



« Chapparal Broom

(Baccharis sarothroides)

Deciduous Shrub - Large bush has broom-like features: blooms in the fall with small white flowers.



« Coast Barrel Cactus

(Ferocactus viridescens)

Succulent - Bright green flesh is arranged into several ribs covered in an array of needles.



« Dove Lupine

(Lupinus bicolor)

Perennial Herb - Sweet pea-like flowers are borne in dense spikes at ends of tall stems.



« Elderberry

(Sambucus mexicana)

Deciduous Tree/Shrub - Blooms have creamy white flowers from April to August, then green berry clusters turn blackish-blue.



« Fish-Hook Cactus

(Mammillaria diocia)

Succulent - Solitary to small family clusters; flowers from February to April. Needles form a hook at the ends.



« Jojoba

(Simmondsia chinensis)

Perennial Shrub - Three to six feet in height: leaves are thick, leathery, and bluish-green. Flowers are inconspicuous.



« Lemonadeberry

(Rhus integrifolia)

Evergreen Shrub - Leathery dark green leaves; white to pinkish flowers in midwinter to spring develop into hairy, sticky red berries.



« Cholla Cactus

(Cylindropuntia prolifera)

Succulent - Tubular stems with spines; red flowers in the summer.



« Cottonwood

(Populus fremontii)

Deciduous Tree - Native to riparian zones; grows 40-60 feet tall with glossy yellow-green leaves.



« Chalk Live-Forever

(Dudleya pulverulenta)

Succulent - This plant grows a rosette from which a 1 1/2 foot spike of red flowers emerges.



« Chocolate Lily

(Fritillaria biflora)

Perennial Herb - This species grows on open grassy slopes; it has dark brownish, unmottled flowers.



« Cleveland Sage (Salvia clevelandii)

Perennial Shrub - Attractive flowering spikes on branch terminals; purple or lavender trumpet shaped clusters.



« Common Golden Stars

(Bloomeria crocea)

Perennial Herb - This plant produces six-petaled golden flowers that are clustered in a loose umbel.



« California Rose

(Rosa californica)

Deciduous Shrub - Produces 1-2 inch pink flowers, rose hips are fragrant.



« California Sagebrush

(Artemisia californica)

Perennial Shrub/Herb - Light green to gray shrub 3-4 feet in height, very aromatic.



« California Sunflower

(Encelia californica)

Perennial Shrub - Stands 3-4 feet high with 2-inch yellow ray flowers surrounded by a reddish-purple center disk.



« Mule-Fat

(Baccharis salicifolia)

Perennial Shrub - This bush has sticky foliage; bears small, fuzzy, pink or red-tinged white flowers.
